'Our Heroes' Exhibition Sale Waterside Arts Center

Using photographs, archive documents and memorabilia from individuals from the local area, it presents their stories of everyday life during those difficult times.

As part of the exhibition, there is a wall dedicated to Chapel St, Altrincham, looking at the narratives of 11 individuals from this famous street.

This display is a poignant tribute to the lives lost on Chapel St.

The exhibition as a whole provides a sensitive tribute to the brave men and women from our community during the First World War.
