It is double the size of our previous location and because of this we are looking to expand both our exhibition programme and our Heritage area so expect big things in the near future.

There is still time to apply for our OPEN CALL's for the Wish you were Here: postcard exhibition in June and our annual Altrincham open 2014: Aurora Borealis in July. However we also have another opportunity that we are encouraging everyone to pass around to the younger generation.

This months issue is dedicated to the annual Trafford Schools Open 2014. This opportunity is open to students in their final year of GCSE, AS and A2 (or equivalent BTEC) in Visual Arts from all schools within Trafford. Although the exhibition is taking place in November, we are encouraging students to register their interest now. (This doesn't mean the work has to be done by then, it just means you need to say you will be involved by this stage). This gives the students the summer holidays to create a new piece of work for the exhibition if they desire to do so, or they can submit pre-existing work created on their course. The exhibition is an Open theme, however we are also hosting an 'Inspired by....Regeneration' Award for A level students; which means that students creating work on the theme of regeneration will be eligible for this additional award. We need your help to spread the word; if you have a relative, neighbour or know a student who may be interested then please pass this into them and get them to spread the word. It is a great opportunity for them to get their work seen outside the school, it's free to enter and there are a number of awards on offer to be won so why not give it a go? On May 31st we are also participating in a Fundraising plant sale to support the Atrincham in Bloom 2014 campaign. We would encourage the local community to come along and support this event as the more support we gain, the better our chance of winning gold this year. The event will run from 10am in the square at the Stamford Quarter.

Keeping with the Easter spirit, the White Rabbit and the rest of wonderland have taken over our New Look display this month. Yes, we present to you Alice Through the Looking Glass; An ambitious exhibition that will explore how something as simple as paper can be transformed into a wonderland of amazing creations. Based on the famous story by Lewis Carroll; Alice Through the Looking Glass is an exhibition filled with fantasy, fragmentation and a play on familiarity evoking in the audience a sense of the uncanny whilst tantaslising the imagination.

For this exhibition, we aim to play upon perception; both in the perception of what constitutes art and the perception of where art should be viewed. Paper is typically seen as being something to create art on and not with, so we have encouraged our artists to take the simple medium of paper and modify it into something beyond it's stereotypical function. Techniques include quilling, origami, paper clay and sculptural forms that will transform a window display into another world. The glass provides a barrier, like the mirror in Alice's tale, that draws the public towards it to see the fantasy land that lies beyond. The exhibition features the work of Julia Brunning, Abigayle Coghlan, Andrea Hamer, Enya Koster, Steve Marsden, Agnieszka Matyjaszek, Paula Sandham and Rebecca Wild and is on until the 21st June.

Sanctuary from the Trenches
Dunham Massey Hall and Gardens

Dunham Massey was transformed during the First World War into the Stamford Military Hospital and became the home of almost 300 soliders during their stay and recovery. In commemoration of the centenary, Dunham Hall has once again been transformed back into the military hospital for visitors to discover what life was life for the patients, staff and members of the household during this time. The exhibit is particularly immersive as parts of the once familiar rooms of the house have been utterly transformed; such as the Great Hall has changed into the soldiers recreation room and the billard room is now the nurses station. Each visitor is given a hospital administration ticket on arrival and become they become intwined with the personal and highly emotive stories of the patients treated over 100 years ago as they explore the hall which is further enhanced by the real-life characters acting out short scenes. The transformation is on until 11 November so you have plenty of time to visit and go back in time to experience first hand the atmosphere of that era.
