Hello fellow art and heritage enthusiasts! We have had a busy, engaging and exciting month, with highlights such as the ongoing Big Draw events, our Halloween-inspired workshop and Poppy Appeal workshop (read more about these in our full article).

Bex Wild, Sharon Robertson, Sarah Walmsley (Our Altrincham) and I attended the 2015 North West In Bloom Awards, held in Southport. We are delighted to announce that Altrincham retained its Gold Award status, and won an additional three Gold awards for The Stamford Quarter Shopping Centre, The Wheatsheaf pub and The Old Roebuck pub. Art with a Heart also was given a *Highly Commended discretionary award* for artistic contribution to the built environment in Altrincham. We would like to take this opportunity to thank our volunteers, local businesses, the community and our visitors who contributed to these efforts.

Jean Brookes from the Altrincham area branch of the British Legion launched the 2015 Poppy Appeal Campaign in our Heritage Area, raising over £100 on the day.

In November, Altrincham businesses took part in a vote regarding the establishment of a Business Improvement District (BID). We are pleased to announce that the vote resulted in a resounding 'YES' and now a five year £1.4m plan will be put into place to improve the town centre, attracting people and businesses back into the centre. Also, we are supporting the 'Outside The Box' exhibition taking place in the Stamford Quarter from November 24th to 29th. Both Bex and Jenny Jamieson (as part of her university placement in Art with a Heart) have been working tirelessly on this project over the past few months.

Art with a Heart relies on volunteers to help deliver our programme of activities and from June 2014 to July 2015 this amounted to approximately 6,000 hours. We believe Arts and Heritage are excellent vehicles to enhance the skills of our volunteers, improving their employment opportunities and developing our volunteer programme. Having applied to Altrincham Community Panel for funding, we are pleased to have been awarded £4,552.50, provided we can secure match funding of the same amount. We have a VirginMoneyCampaign, a Kickstarter Project and other fundraising activities. Thank you once again for your support in 2015 and have a good christmas and a happy new year.





HERITAGE REVIEW






It has been a busy year for the dedicated heritage area of the gallery with a number of exhibitions illustrating the rich history of Altrincham and surrounding areas.

Faces of Altrincham, our first exhibition of the year, explored the individuals who were a part of that history and who were integral to the make-up of the town. Individuals such as Alfred Ingham, Lady Jane Turnbull and Edward Adamson were explored in detail, chronicling the part they played in laying the foundation stones of Altrincham today.

Waterways of Trafford portrayed the development of the Manchester Ship Canal and Bridgewater Canal featuring photography by Norman Spilsbury and archival images from the Daily Telegraph. The exhibition explored the profound impact the canal's construction had on the area. This was a collaboration with the Friends of the Bridgewater Canal.

Parks of Altrincham looked at the parks and green spaces of the area: their development and subsequent establishment as public spaces for the community. The exhibition explored parks such as Stamford Park through the ages and how it became a treasured feature of the town.

Broadheath Industry, running through August and much of September, explored the peak of industrial works in Broadheath - the individuals who played a pivotal role in establishing Trafford industry and the working class families who were a part of that era. The exhibition looked at companies such as Linotype, H.W Kearns, Budenberg and Churchills, who were established in Broadheath.







To coincide with Halloween, we decided to do something a little different with our Heritage area so we created the spooky exhibition, 'Ghost Town'. The theme was haunted locations in and around Altrincham with an interactive map where visitors could provide feedback in the form of ghost stories relating to each of the locations.

Ghost Town looked at buildings and landmarks around the town that are known for their spooky, unexplained phenomena, sharing in some local folklore and ghost sightings where and when they took place. The exhibition was an eye-opener for our guests who shared their own experiences and discovered a few haunted places they might not have known about before!

Overall, our Heritage space has continued to expand and grow, thanks to recent additions to our collection (your generous donations) and the excellent feedback we have received. Expect a host of new and exciting exhibitions in the following months!

The Trafford Schools Open is an annual exhibition featuring students in their final year of GCSE, AS and A2 (or equivalent BTEC) in Visual Arts studying within the Borough of Trafford. There are seven awards on offer for students, including the 'Inspired by...' Festivals and Celebrations award. The exhibition showcases the next generation of artists and a wide range of mediums and styles are on display. Five schools have taken part this year providing almost fifty works of art between them.


